ELIGIBILITY

Student must:

- Be nominated by their home institution as an exhange applicant
- Completed at least one year (2 semesters) of study
- Meet the Myongji University's undergraduate language proficiency (or equivalent)

Receive acceptance from MJU	The Certificate of Admission, Letter of Acceptance, and other relevant documents will be issued by MJU between late December and early January.	
Apply for a student visa	Upon receiving the Certificate of Business Registration, students are required to apply for a visa without delay.	
Book your flight ticket	It is recommended that students purchase their flight ticket after obtaining the visa, since timely issuance of the visa cannot be guaranteed	
Buy travel insurance Students are required to obtain travel insurance value from the date of departure to mid-April (Spring semester).		
Apply for KLEC (If needed)	Students opting for additional intensive Korean courses are required to apply separately and pay the corresponding fees

> Credit Information The total number of credits per semester cannot exceed 17

Each KLEC session = 6 credits

If you take 1 KLEC session (6 credits) → You may register for up to 11 undergraduate credits

If you take 2 KLEC sessions (12 credits) → You may register for up to 5 undergraduate credits
